



The CHIEF THEATER, now in its sixth year of operation, provides the Yampa Valley and its visitors a diverse array of cultural and entertainment options. From live theatre, comedy and magic to music, dance and films, the Chief has something for everyone! The Chief Players theatre troupe needs support for scripts, royalties, sets and costumes to support two productions.

WHY SUPPORT US?

The average cost for a Chief Players Production is \$2,500. The Chief Players are Steamboat's only year-round theatre troupe.

OPERA STEAMBOAT is the only opera company serving Northwest Colorado bringing the appreciation of the musical arts among residents and visitors. In addition to producing acclaimed opera productions, Opera Steamboat provides world-class education for visiting young artists, hands-on community programs for schools and the community, and promotes Steamboat Springs as a vibrant and collaborative arts and culture destination.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Ticket sales account for less than 20% of our production budget. To keep our programming affordable, additional support is needed.

> FRIENDS OF THE YAMPA works to protect and enhance the Yampa's environmental and recreational integrity. FOTY is the Yampa River's main watershed group organizing projects and volunteers across the basin for a multitude of efforts. This grant request is for a large format, "Yampa is Wild" mural that will be placed in downtown Steamboat Springs.

WHY SUPPORT US?

We are looking to paint this mural from August through September and have it finalized by November 2018.

HISTORIC ROUTT COUNTY! is the voice

Managing physical preservation projects is the cornerstone of our work; we request support to nominate historic properties to local, state, and national historic registers.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Grant management for preservation projects is our primary source of earned income. We need resources to kick start new projects.

The LUTTRELL BARN CULTURAL CENTER

FOUNDATION was formed with the purpose of restoring the century-old Luttrell Barn for community, heritage, arts, and humanities use. They serve the communities of Moffat, Rio Blanco, and Routt counties. Covering the north entrance in a visually pleasing, historically similar, and safe way allows them to further the safe year-round use of the barn.

WHY SUPPORT US?

A large portion of the necessary funds were secured, we are nearing the end of the funds.

A consistent and even surface for dancers is essential for safety. A projectable space is crucial to lighting designs for theatre and dance performances.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Admission free performances and professional quality requires professional actors to assist local performers and lead teen workshops.

SEMINARS AT STEAMBOAT, founded in 2003, brings nationally prominent speakers who are experts on current public policy issues to the individuals of Steamboat Springs and Northwest Colorado, with the goal of engaging the community in substantive policy topics. The five seminars held each summer are non-partisan, free to the public and attract 500 people on average to each event.

WHY SUPPORT US?

We have broad community support through donations of \$250 or less but have limited support at the sponsor level.



As the only art museum in Northwest Colorado, the STEAMBOAT ART MUSEUM is presenting distinctive exhibits relevant to the West. Our renovated building has afforded SAM to become a cultural center for exhibits, a community gathering destination and an educational venue. This request is to purchase computers and monitors to offer quality educational resources for our programs and the public.

WHY SUPPORT US?

With the recent expansion, these technical additions will finalize our goals of providing optimal community and educational resources.

The STEAMBOAT SPRINGS ARTS COUNCIL

WHY SUPPORT US?

With 31% program growth, funding will ensure that children with financial or special needs can engage in creative enrichment.

The STEAMBOAT SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

inspires our community to appreciate both traditional and modern classical music as a means to communicate the human experience. In keeping with this year's theme, "Triumph of the Human Spirit," we will present Beethoven's 5th symphony in conjunction with an innovative, interactive leadership and team building program offered to local high school students at no charge.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Teaching leadership and team building through music and the structure of an orchestra meets our community outreach mission.

The TREAD OF PIONEERS MUSEUM pre-

serves, shares and celebrates the history and heritage of Routt County. Recently, we received the 133-year photo collection from the Steamboat Pilot newspaper, Steamboat's oldest local business. We are seeking funds to help us digitize the collection and make it accessible to the public via our online photo database that currently features over 7,000 historical images.

WHY SUPPORT US?

This is the largest single collection we have ever received, with an estimated 20,000 images that need to be processed.

Since 1980, WEST SLOPE FM (WSFM) has been the only radio source of classical music in the Yampa Valley. We bring it to the Yampa Valley from Trenton, NJ via our equipment on Storm Peak. Our engineer says this equipment must be replaced if WSFM is to stay on the air. Please help us keep this music coming.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Our tower rent increased 150% in 2015. Wind, ice and snow have worn out our equipment; it must be replaced.




The YAMPA VALLEY CHORAL SOCIETY is

composed of several choirs whose twofold purpose is to provide challenging and engaging vocal opportunities for both singers and audiences from Routt and Moffat Counties. WHY SUPPORT US?

All youth need adult support, a safe and positive place and meaningful programs to reach their full potential.

NEWBORN NETWORK PARENT EDUCA-

TORS serve families in the critical early years of their children's lives, with several parent education programs. These Infant & Toddler experts deliver high-touch programming to more than 240 families across Routt County. Newborn Network is requesting funding to provide Play and Learn programming in Oak Creek, a "child care desert."

WHY SUPPORT US?

More than one-million new neural connections are formed every second in the first years of life.

As societal norms shift and change, the expectations placed upon fathers continue to transform. The FATHERHOOD PROGRAM OF ROUTT COUNTY (FPRC) provides education, support and builds the community for area dads to meet these changing demands so that they, and their families, can thrive. The FPRC requests \$5,000 to support items and activities related to its evidence-based classes and workshops.

WHY SUPPORT US?

The FPRC cannot apply for funding offered to 501c3s and lost a major funding partner in 2017.

Since 2004. INTEGRATED COMMUNITY has served as the recognized leader and go-to source for immigrant residents in Routt and Moffat Counties. The programs respond to the needs of collaborating agencies, providers and the ever increasing immigrant/limited English speaking population in Northwest Colorado. Funds from the YVCF will support the Resource & Referral services.

WHY SUPPORT US?

In 2017, Resource & Referral service grew 50% and thus far in 2018 it is up 30% due to new families arriving.

NWRM CASA is the only state and federally approved organization to provide volunteer advocacy for abused and neglected children in Routt County. We are also the only organization to provide certified supervised visitation for children and their families in a trauma sensitive environment. We are requesting funds to help provide quality services and advocacy for these children in our communities.

WHY SUPPORT US?

We have more case related expense requests each year than we have money for. Supervised visitation is new for 2018.

The OAK CREEK SCHOOL-AGE CHILDCARE

PROGRAM offers an affordable licensed program. It serves many South Routt low-income at-risk youth and their families with after-school, full day Friday and summer programming in a safe, nurturing and mentor-based environment. We are seeking scholarship funding to meet our goal of not denying participation to any child due to their families' inability to pay.

WHY SUPPORT US?

We expect to continue to have a 40%+ rate of participants requiring full or partial scholarships to access programming.





Part-time School Based Mentor to serve Steamboat Springs High School @ \$5,000

Since 1996, **PARTNERS** has been serving at risk youth ages 7-17 in Routt County. We believe in, and research supports, the immeasurable power of providing youth with a consistent caring adult in their life. We strive to provide mentors to serve that role to students in the school setting, but are \$12,000 short on funding for one position.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Without AmeriCorps members, payroll costs have increased by 77% for this program.

SOS receives support from local foundations/organizations, however seeks expansion to impact 50 South Routt County and 30 Craig underserved youth.

TOTALLY KIDS, INC. is committed to providing services for youth in West Routt County. Youth ages 5 to 12 are served and provided a safe, supervised environment. The demographics of the area have changed and over 50% of the children attending Hayden Valley Elementary are living below the poverty level. Funding is needed to provide scholarships for the neediest children.

WHY SUPPORT US? The needs are increasing - we have more children that need assistance.

The YAMPA VALLEY PREGNANCY CENTER

has served pregnant teens and women and anyone raising infants and toddlers for 34 years by offering infant and toddler care items and lessons on the stages of pregnancy, parenting and life skills. We need a parttime Earn While You Learn staff person so the executive director can seek support from local businesses, churches and individuals.

WHY SUPPORT US?

This is a newly created position in 2018, expanding capacity for the organization.

Evidence suggests that mental health support immediately following a critical incident can drastically improve long-term adaptivity and functioning of affected individuals. Funding for the **COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE** FUND to support a rapid response debriefing process following a critical incident would decrease the effects of trauma on individuals and allow a confidential/safe space for those affected by the critical incident to seek assistance.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Past critical incidents in our community include: Witnessessing of a traumatic work related accident or horrific car accident; Lose of a fellow employee to suicide.

FREEDOM HOOVES has been providing Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies that positively impact participants' quality of life for over 6 years. Freedom Hooves collaborates with individuals, businesses, groups, and foundations to provide services that empower lives and promotes healthier citizenship for years to come.

WHY SUPPORT US? We are becoming fiscally stable by moving to employees in-lieu of contracts as well as owning horses.

HORIZONS helps individuals with intellectual and developmental delays and disabilities and their families live meaningful, productive lives of their own choosing. As the first point of entry, Horizons guides people in accessing person-centered supports. Our Family Support program reimburses parents for out-of-pocket expenses related to their child's delay or disability that are not covered by any other funding source.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Family Support is a payor of last resort, helping families provide appropriate, necessary care for their child with a delay/disability.

Northwest Colorado Community Health Partnership

The HEALTH PARTNERSHIP works to ensure all residents have access to programs and services they need to be their healthiest self. Agency activities include but are not limited to identifying gaps in service, working to create community-wide efficiencies and reduce duplication, collaborating with health and wellness partners, collecting and leveraging regional data to support decision making, and advancing community-driven solutions.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Local funding is essential to the agency receiving a \$365,000 federal USDA 30-year low interest loan for the new office space.

WHY SUPPORT US?

Supporting children in coping with grief and loss and preventing future negative health outcomes and risky behaviors is an upstream approach.

WHY SUPPORT US?

190 women will die from uterine or cervical cancer in Colorado in 2018. 62% of Steamboat Springs patients are uninsured.

STARS programs help individuals with disabilities discover the outdoors and teach skills to overcome health challenges and develop self-esteem. STARS uses skiing, biking, and other activities to empower youth and adults with disabilities. These activities reduce depression and isolation, while increasing physical activity, self-sufficiency and hope. We are asking for funds to extend Adaptive PE programs to our schools.

WHY SUPPORT US?

We expect that we will increase school programming by 14% this next year and need funding for the additional programs.

MEMORIAL REGIONAL HEALTH, a 25 bed, acute care, level IV trauma, critical access hospital has serviced our community for 70 years. Over the last several years, MRH has seen an increase in behavioral healthcare services. To address this increase, MRH will implement telehealth services for behavioral healthcare in our new facility. By providing telemedicine we hope to create a meaningful impact within our community.



It is our purpose to support them with direct services and advocacy to realize their potential and maximize the quality of life for

CCMRH merged with Advocates in 2018 to end the risk of losing free assistance services for local residents in their darkest times.

LIFTUP ROUTT COUNTY is a local nonprofit that turns community donations into food, shelter, medicine, transportation and other support for 10% of Routt County's residents every year. Community donations are sold in LiftUp's Thrift Store, which helps fund our food bank and helps provide goods and services to community members in times of need.

WHY SUPPORT US?


