DEAR FRIENDS

Forty-five years ago, a group of Steamboat citizens banded together to form an organization on a simple premise: that even small acts of generosity could improve the well-being of others and result in lasting impact. Today, that organization is the Yampa Valley Community Foundation and our staff, board members, and many community volunteers proudly carry on that belief in the power of philanthropy.

In October of 2023, we moved into our new headquarters at 4th and Oak in downtown Steamboat. The building is more than an office – it's a permanent home for the institution and a physical symbol of our perpetual commitment to the Yampa Valley. In the few months since we moved in, we're thrilled to have been able to fill a great need for many organizations who are using the space for meetings and events

Last year we added an exciting and powerful new resource to support nonprofits and organizations in the region. We've been contemplating how to deliver more local assistance in addition to the grantmaking we do every year. Our new Impact Investment program leverages a small portion of what we currently invest in Wall Street and instead provides financing on Main Street with organizations we know so well. As you will read in this report, we piloted the idea after learning about the City of Craig's efforts to build a 20-unit for-sale affordable housing project. Now, with our first loan successfully made, we look forward to making other types of loans to support the financing needs of local nonprofits, large and small.

We are also proud of the impact we've made through our crisis funding efforts. Inspired by the spring flooding in Hayden and encouraged by the generosity of our donors, we urged nonprofits to let us know when they experience a sudden need and unbudgeted expense. As a result, we helped address over a dozen emergency needs including \$75,000 to pay for travelling nurses to fill critical gaps in nursing for hospice and home health services (Northwest Colorado Health), \$77,000 to repair the roof of the Community Budget Center in Craig which otherwise would not be able to stay open, and \$42,000 to cover unexpected demand for free mental health counseling offered by REPS. In all, we raised and granted out over \$500,000 for crisis needs in 2023.

Philanthropy is rooted in compassion, empathy, and a deep sense of social responsibility. Our partnership with community members like you who share our belief in the power of philanthropy inspires our work. Thank you for trusting us as your philanthropic partner in this life-long endeavor.

NONPROFIT INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT PROGRAM

In 2023, YVCF served as one of eight Regional Access Partners statewide to help administer the State of Colorado's Department of Local Affairs NPI Grant Program. The program was created to support small, community-based organizations in underrepresented communities disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The work culminated in YVCF awarding \$3.7 million to Northwest Colorado nonprofits and will continue with three years of reporting and monitoring. In our five-county region of Eagle, Garfield, Moffat, Rio Blanco, and Routt, 56 nonprofits are receiving funding for infrastructure and capacity building to proactively invest in their organization's health.

The goal of YVCF's Impact Grant program, a sub-program of the Community Grant Cycle launched in 2022, is to bring new essential programs to the Yampa Valley, fill gaps in services provided, and increase access for diverse underserved populations. In 2023, four organizations received funding for projects that aim to be transformative for our community and/or the organization.



Better Tomorrow was awarded \$30,000 to help create a dedicated LGBTQIA+ Resource Center to reduce bullying, increase access to medical and mental health providers with specific expertise, and improve accessibility of all relevant services in Routt County.



Friends of Perry Mansfield was awarded \$30,000 toward renovations to the historic Julie Harris Theatre. The improvements will allow PerryMansfield to offer year-round programming, increase the reach of their programs, and provide space for other nonprofits for meetings, performances, and other uses.



The Veterans Center is a new nonprofit with the mission to support all members, past and present, of the armed forces. Their \$30,000 grant will go toward renovating the historic Schubring-Cruse VFW Post #4264 building to expand access to resources for veterans.



Yampa Valley Autism (YVAP) received \$17,449 to offer autism spectrum disorder assessments for children in Routt and Moffat Counties. By providing assessments locally, YVAP has decreased wait times, removed transportation barriers, and increased Medicaid acceptance, thus increasing health equity in our community.

CRISIS FUNDING

An important but underrecognized safety net function that YVCF provides in the community is nimble fundraising and responsive grantmaking in crisis situations. Through trusted partnerships with donors, nonprofits, and other organizations plus an expertise in effective philanthropy, YVCF can quickly pivot during crisis situations and direct funds where and when they are needed most, ensuring a thriving and connected Yampa Valley.

Significant snow levels during the 2022-23 winter caused hazardous and in some cases catastrophic damage to which YVCF was able to rapidly respond with the help of our network of generous donors. In our first occasion to open an emergency fund since the COVID pandemic, we quickly raised \$148,000 into the Hayden Flood Relief Fund to help households at or below 160% average median income with repairs essential to health and safety such as mold mitigation, repairing drywall and insulation, and replacing appliances.

Major damage from snow and ice to the Community Budget Center in Craig threatened the viability of staying open to provide critical thrift store and financial assistance to Moffat County residents. After learning of the issue through the Community Grant Cycle process, we reached out to our community of donors and were able to rapidly deploy a gift of \$77,000 to fill the insurance gap and fund essential repairs. Genevieve Yazzie, Executive Director of CBC says, "It was extremely enlightening to learn how much community support is out there."

SCHOLARSHIP SPOTLIGHT JACKSON LEWER

Jackson Lewer is an exceptional student – twice exceptional in fact. Jackson graduated from Steamboat Springs High School in 2021, concurrently earning an associate degree from Colorado Mountain College and accruing significant credits toward a bachelor's degree. He was a 2021 recipient of the William P. Spyker Memorial Scholarship for students with Individual Education Plans and received that renewable scholarship again in 2022 and 2023. In 2023 he also received awards from Yampa Tuition Grants and the Yampa Valley Electric Association Scholarship. He's currently enrolled at Colorado State University and making progress toward a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering. His scholarships have been instrumental in allowing him to take advantage of extra academic support and independent living services for neurodiverse students at CSU, as well as giving extra affirmation and peace of mind. Jackson says, "I wouldn't be able to succeed in college if I was stressed about being able to afford it."

DONOR SPOTLIGHT

HAROLD & PEGGY KAMINS

Harold and Peggy approached YVCF for help implementing a scholarship modelled after one in their former home of Connecticut. Yampa Tuition Grants (YTG) supports students with financial need in Routt and Moffat Counties in their pursuit of post-secondary education. In 2023, its first year, YTG awarded an impressive \$195,000 to 39 students.

Harold and Peggy say, "YVCF worked closely with us to implement our idea and because they already have critical application and administrative infrastructure in place, the process was made straightforward. Maybe most important, they share our vision for a local, need-based college grant program."



Bob Enever is no stranger to philanthropy. He and his late wife Audrey founded the Yampa River Botanic Park with a vision of flower gardens set in a treed landscape with a stream and ponds; a serene place for people to commune with nature. The Enevers donated the land, designed and funded the Park, and spent the next ten years building and managing it until a board of citizen-gardeners could take the reins in 2007. Through the Enever Botanic Park Endowment Fund established in 1997, over \$1 million has been granted to support operations and fund construction of the Trillium House. The Enevers were recognized with YVCF's Philanthropist of the Year Award in 1999, the City of Steamboat Springs' Heritage Award in 2012, and the Yampa Valley Sustainability Council's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2024.

When it came time for Bob to think about estate planning, he reached out to YVCF for advice on continuing his charitable giving after his lifetime. We were honored to help him establish the Bob and Audrey Enever Legacy Fund which will support thirty local, state, and national nonprofits after his passing.

Bob says, "YVCF staff were very supportive in considering the causes I care about and helping me identify nonprofits I'm pleased to support after I'm gone. YVCF made the process of writing up a legacy fund smooth and enjoyable."

ACCELERATING HOUSING

Building Community is the fourth and most overarching of the Yampa Valley Community Foundation's strategic priorities. It centers our work and is integral to our vision of 'a thriving Yampa Valley where there are opportunities and resources for all.' Toward this effort, YVCF engages with organizations across the region to better understand community issues so that we may effectively collaborate toward our mission of building vibrant communities.

Recognizing that the lack of affordable housing causes a cascade of issues and is the most significant challenge impacting the Yampa Valley today, YVCF opened, with the support of an anonymous donor, the Yampa Valley Housing Accelerator Fund in 2023. The fund enabled us to loan \$2.5 million to the Craig Housing Authority (CHA) for a 20 unit for-sale deed-restricted townhouse development, as well as provide expertise to CHA for their first major project as we piloted our new Impact Investment Program.









YVCF's Passport Club charitable ski pass program is made possible through a valued 25+ year partnership with the Steamboat Ski & Resort Corporation (SSRC). Proceeds from the program generate funds for YVCF operations and for grants and scholarships through SSRC's Charitable Fund, Environmental Fund and Scholarship Fund.

Since the program's inception, the Passport Club has generated over \$9.4 million in support for nonprofits and students.






