Details: We will walk from South Rim to North Rim on October 11th then return on October 13th. In three days, we will span 44 miles, climb over 11,000 feet and descend over 11,000 feet.

Volunteers helping every runner to benefit the South Routt Education Endowment Fund

On September 14 and 15, a group of brave runners completed the Run Rabbit Run 100 mile trail race in Steamboat Springs, CO. And members of the South Routt Education Endowment Fund (SREEF) helped every runner by staffing the Fish Creek Aid Station.

Even if you are well prepared, running 100 miles over mountainous terrain is a very difficult task. It becomes even more difficult when the task must be completed non-stop, day and night, in less than 35 hours.

The race began at the base of Mt. Werner and covered over 20,000 vertical feet of elevation gains and losses. The trails and hills they conquered included Steamboat Mountain, Dry Lake Campground, Emerald Mountain, and many other of our most scenic locations.

When they arrived at Fish Creek Aid Station (about 17 miles into the race), a group of SREEF Volunteers handed out food, refilled water bottles, offered medical aid, and encouraged every runner.

SREEF has a long history with [Run Rabbit Run](#) race. A relay team of South Routt teachers, parents, and community members completed the 100-mile course at its inaugural event in 2012. During that event, the SREEF charity raised over \$5,000. This year, SREEF has collected additional donations and we have now passed the \$100,000 milestone of funding!
